

# TRUST AORAKI

Trust Aoraki has been supporting not-for-profit organisations in the South Canterbury region for over 16 years. Trust Aoraki has a strategy of supporting amateur sport, in particular those competitors striving for **excellence**. **Participation** is another key factor of Trust Aoraki support-where as many people benefit from grant funds as possible. Also, it is about "locals supporting locals" - 100% of available grant funds go into events and projects within the region from where the grant funds are generated. It is very supportive of events that bring people and economic benefits into the local community.

A minimum of 70% of the funds distributed goes towards amateur sports and up to 30% of funds distributed goes towards community, health, arts and education.

TOTAL grant distribution from Trust Aoraki **since 2003 is over \$17 million**. SIGNIFICANT grants within this include projects such as CBAY Aquatic Centre, SC Hockey Turf, Tennis SC Centre, SC Athletics Track, Park Centre Community Care Facility, Te Ana Maori Rock Art Centre, Phar Lap Statue, Temuka Domain Redevelopment, Alps 2 Ocean Cycle Way, Hagley Oval Pavillion, Ranui House Accommodation Facility Christchurch.

In the most recent financial year Trust Aoraki distributed **\$1,590,709** to its local communities. This included grants to organisations such as SC Drama League, Timaru District Council/Water Skills, SC District Cricket, SC Basketball, Hockey SC, Netball SC, SC Rugby Football Union, SC Football, Central South Island Charity Bike Ride, Timaru Riding for the Disabled, Fraser Park Community Trust, Cycling South Canterbury, YMCA, Temuka Amateur Swimming Club, Fairlie Golf Club, Mackenzie Ice Hockey, Waimate Shears, Canterbury Cricket, North Canterbury BMX Club, Rangiora Boxing Club. Events locally that Trust Aoraki gave major grant support to (in keeping with the philosophy of economic benefits to the local area) were Mid South Canterbury Cycling Association-South Island Secondary Schools Cycling Champs, Timaru Yacht and Power Boat Club - Roaring 40s Event in Timaru and Aviemore Classic in Otematata, Surf Life Saving NZ - Southern Region Pool Champs, South Island Masters Games Timaru, Motorcycling NZ and South Canterbury Motorcycle Club - Round 2 Superbike Champs at Levels Raceway, South Canterbury Car Club - Super Truck Event, Mid South Canterbury Sub Centre of Athletics Canterbury - NZ Masters Track and Field Champs. In keeping with the '**excellence**' philosophy of Trust Aoraki numerous amateur athletes/teams/officials have had grant support for their travel costs at international level eg. Timaru Triathlon Club, SC Roller Sports Club, Timaru Ploughing Match Association, SC Rugby Football Union, Hockey SC, Oamaru Tap Dancing Association (SC resident competitor), Lake Tekapo Powerboat and Waterski Club, South Island Rowing Incorporated.
